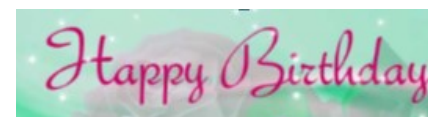

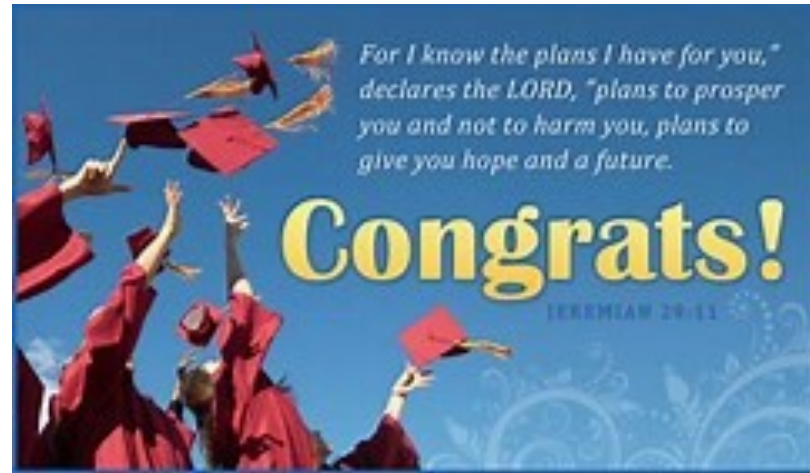
Now that school is coming to an end...many of you will be heading out for vacations and family visits. We will keep all of you in prayer for safe travel and safe return.

Thank you for the gift you are to this community.

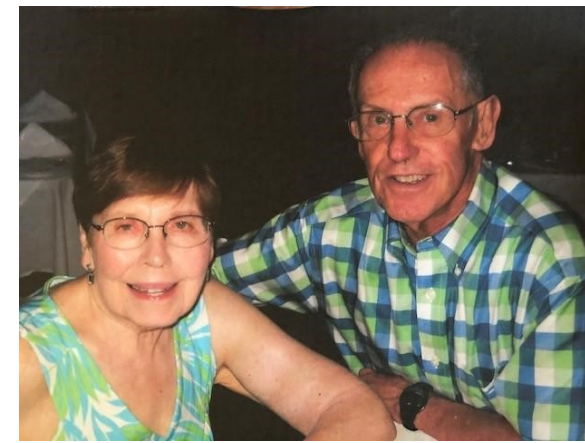
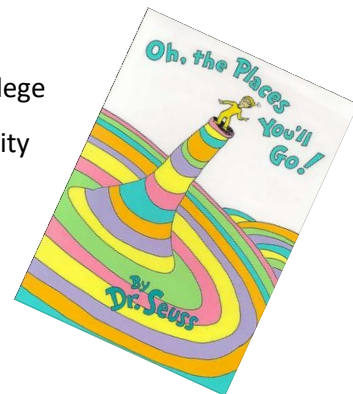
